Pastor Ingrid's Corner



This is the final in a twelve-part series of articles counting down the "Top twelve reasons why worship at Zion is out of this world"

#1 God Surprises Us Every Week in the Last Place We'd Look

"O that you would rend the heavens and come down..." pleads Isaiah, along with those of every time and place who want God to *do* something. At times of crisis especially, we may wish God to make a grand gesture, perform a miracle, reveal his power in a way that would assure *us* and make our enemies quake - including the enemy of disease.

However, in Christ we meet a God who chooses to reveal himself in weakness, not strength. The Christmas story reveals that God entered the world in the most vulnerable way, as a baby in a manger. Not only as a dependent, weak little baby, but one born into poverty, not wealth; and to unknown, unremarkable parents, not noble, powerful or famous ones. When grown, how does this One exit the world? Amid trumpets and fanfare? Once again, God chooses to reveal his power and glory in a place we'd never look for it – in words of forgiveness at his own execution. For Martin Luther, the manger and the cross are never far apart, meaning that they reveal a "weak" God; that is, when measured by *this* world's standards.

What this means for us is that we find God in the last place we'd think to look. Not in power but weakness, not in glory but in shame, not in victory but in defeat. What this means for us is that God continues to use weak things by which to come to us – in a weak Word written and proclaimed, in a skimpy Meal (Communion), and in the common element of Water (Baptism). God *has* rent the heavens and come down in Christ to be with us in the midst of crises, darkness, and chaos, to assure us and to give us trust or faith. In the end, faith itself is the grandest miracle God performs in us on earth.

After much deliberation over the recommendations from Worship & Music and the Reopening Task Group, Zion's Congregation Council decided to plan for a virtual 4PM Children's Christmas Eve service, and an in-person and virtual 8PM Holy Communion service. All protocols for current Sunday worship will be in place. **Signing up will be required** and we expect that people may have to be turned away at the door in order to care for the neighbor and keep everyone as safe as possible. The signup list will be available on 12/14 (via website & Happenings that week), and anybody who signs up and then learns they cannot attend should **immediately email or call** the church office or Pastor Ingrid so that their spot can be used by someone else.

As our Council President wrote, the opportunity to have in-person worship should not be interpreted to mean that your congregation leaders have decided that worship is safe for all. Please use your best judgment based on health, risks and circumstances to decide whether attending in person is a wise choice for you and a loving action for your neighbor. Live-streaming sounds & video to improve significantly!



Parishioners have been very gracious since March and have offered encouragement and gratitude for the live-streaming we've been able to cobble together with amateur equipment, namely Pastor Ingrid's computer, phone, software and analog microphone.

We now look forward to having more professional equipment installed and hard-wired into our sound and internet system.

The NJ Synod has covered \$6800 of our \$7,800 live-streaming worship project, and the remaining \$1,000 will come from Barry Blaine's memorial gifts. The NJ Synod offered COVID-19 "loans" to congregations for ministries that needed support in this unique time and Zion applied for our live-streaming project. The "loan" will be forgiven at the rate of 25%/year for four years, given that we continue to use the ministry – and we plan to do so! This way, after the pandemic is over, people who are homebound and recuperating in hospital or home will be able to worship with the congregation.

We are very thankful for NJ Synod's creative response and for their partnership in ministry.

News from your congregation council

Thank you to Cathleen: We regret to inform you that Professional demands have increased for Cathleen Sullivan, school nurse, so that she has had to resign from Congregation council. Thank you for your service to our congregation, Cathleen!

New Council Member: When there is a vacancy on the Congregation council between annual meetings, the council elects a new member, as specified in our Constitution. At our November 17th meeting, Jance Denzler was elected to the council and will serve as council secretary through the February 7, 2021 annual meeting. Thank you for serving on council, Jance!

At the annual meeting, the congregation will elect someone to fill the remainder of the term to which Cathleen was elected in February of 2020 (one more year), as well as elect for two year terms people to serve in two additional council seats whose terms will be complete.

In Person Worship Continues: At our November 17th meeting, the council considered how to proceed with worship services for the Advent and Christmas seasons, even as the number of cases of Covid-19 are again increasing in our area. The council decided to continue to offer one in person service each Sunday and to hold one in person service on Christmas Eve. You can find more information on the holiday schedule elsewhere in this newsletter. This was a difficult decision for the council as we wrestled with differing recommendations from the Reopening Task Group, the Worship and Music committee and the Bishop's office. We desire to keep everyone safe and healthy, not only with respect to viral infection, but mentally and spiritually, as well. The opportunity to have in person worship should not be interpreted as meaning that your congregation leaders have decided that in person worship is safe for all. Please use your best judgment of your circumstances to help you decide whether attending in person is a wise for you. Please keep in mind the request from state officials to quarantine if you are arriving from several out of state locations. While seeing returning far flung members of our church family is a highlight of this time of year with colleges on breaks and families reuniting, this year we ask you to observe the precautions and stay home until the two week quarantine period is past. This will help to keep us all a bit safer.

The light shall conquer the darkness -that is good news for the end of this difficult year.



A Note From The Re-Opening Task Group

Personal Risk Assessment for in-person worship attendance

When the decision to resume in-person worship indoors in the sanctuary was made in September, the number of new Covid-19 cases per day was one-tenth of what it is now and the number of patients hospitalized for Covid-19 disease, both locally and statewide, was one fifth of the current level. It is important to recognize that conditions have changed significantly for the worse. Hospitalizations for Covid-19 in NJ have tripled over the past several weeks but are still below levels seen in the spring. The trend is accelerating upward.

The rapid spread of Covid-19 infections in the community and growing rate of hospitalizations (a better indication of disease severity than infected cases alone) have increased the risks of exposure faced by those who participate in in-person worship regardless of how stringent our mitigation measures are. The continued offering of in-person worship should not be construed as an indication that it is safe for all to attend.

We would presume that anyone not feeling well would refrain from attending in-person worship but, as the prevalence of infection in the local community increases and there is the usual seasonal influx of visitors and extended family from other locations, the likelihood of being exposed to an asymptomatic infected individual in an indoor enclosed setting like our worship service increases.

We have made every effort to keep our indoor church environment as safe as possible for in-person worship by limiting and spreading out those in attendance, sanitizing the sanctuary thoroughly and professionally each week before and after the service and running barn fans that increase ventilation of the sanctuary with outside air during the service. No formal engineering analysis of the effectiveness of this ventilation setup has been done. The content of the service is carefully planned so as to minimize the duration of exposure and attendance records are collected so that contact tracing can be performed if an infected person is identified as having attended worship.

We have been blessed by the cooperation of the worshippers with safety protocols including the use of masks and physical distancing. It is important for those planning to attend in-person worship at this time to weigh their own personal risk factors for Covid-19 disease. It has been well established that the severity of Covid-19 disease increases with age (although younger people are not exempt from severe disease) and is also influenced by sex (males tend to do worse) and a variety of co-existing disease conditions. Individuals with diabetes, cancer, cardiovascular disease (including increased blood pressure) and lung, kidney or liver disease are at increased risk of severe disease if they get infected. As many of the severe effects of Covid-19 infection are caused by the body's immune system reacting to the virus, individuals with underlying disorders of the immune system are especially at risk.

Please carefully consider your own personal physical risks and the risks faced by others in your household when weighing your decision to participate in in-person or virtual worship. Zion's Youtube broadcasts of the service have been steadily improving in technical quality and offer an opportunity to maintain and improve your spiritual and mental health with less physical risk.

O come, o come Emmanuel- God is with us wherever we are.
