Nearly 17 million veterans live among us in the United States.

November 11 is a day set aside, "intended to thank living Veterans for their service, to acknowledge that their contributions to our national security are appreciated, and to underscore the fact that all those who served - not only those who died - have sacrificed and done their duty" (U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs). As a congregation, we regularly pray for all who serve in ways that support and protect us, but on November 12, we will also give thanks for the sacrifices of relationship, time, salary, peace of mind (see below) and body that veterans and also their families have made on our behalf.

This is very appropriate for peace-loving Christians to do. Even though Christians have always regularly prayed for peace between the nations, we also realize that we live in a broken world. In order to restrain evil, there are times that war, fighting and killing become the lesser of two evils.

Recently, I directed a Korean War veteran to Martin Luther's writing "Whether Soldiers, Too, Can Be Saved." I don't think he is the only veteran who is very disturbed in spirit about having killed. Luther's words speak to our time as to the 16<sup>th</sup> century: "...In the same way, when I think of a soldier fulfilling his office by punishing the wicked, killing the wicked, and creating so much misery, it seems an un-Christian work completely contrary to Christian love. But when I think of how it protects the good and keeps and preserves wife and child, house and farm, property, and honor and peace, then I see how precious and godly this work is; and I observe that it amputates a leg or a hand, so that the whole body may not perish..."

Veterans, we set aside merely a day, but we should regularly give thanks to God for you and the peace and protection that you have helped to bring to this country and this world.

Payments of \$3,900 are made each month. At the current pace of giving and scheduled monthly payments, Zion will run out of funding for mortgage payments during the 2nd quarter of 2025.

#### Treasurer's Comments: looking at the last 2 months of 2023

In the 4th quarter of 2022 (last year), the Congregation contributed more than \$79,000 which is nearly double the normal; it was needed since through September 2022 we were deficit spending by ~\$27,000. In 2023 we find ourselves in a similar situation due to the seasonality that summer giving causes. As such, it is requested that those who donated so generously last year consider repeating that in the 4th quarter of 2023 so that our finances are strong entering 2024.

Giving in October 2023 was below October 2022 by approximately (\$11,000).

Zion does not utilize fundraisers for the Operating Budget. Zion depends solely on your financial giving to pay for operational expenses.

# **Zion Fall Property Report 2023** Bridging the future While Preserving the Past

## **Completed Work at Zion:**

- Trees around the playground that posed a health and safety hazard have been taken down.
- Repairs to the men's bathroom exhaust fan in Faith Hall is done.
- Lighting for the Faith Hall area and stairways has been updated, in part, to LED's. Ceiling T-8 fluorescents used to be the standard upgrade, but that was 10 + years ago. Now as the fixture's life ends, they will be converted to a more energy saving LEDs in the future and as the budgets allow.
- Indoor air quality in the sanctuary has been tested and is excellent. (Full report available upon request).
- Bulletin boards as well as dry eraser boards are installed. Paper shredding is completed.
- Natural gas usage report from the gas company demonstrates that the efforts to improve our consumption and usage has been a success. It is significant and has demonstrated that we are trying to be as responsible as we can in this energy sensitive society. Yes, we are doing our part to the best of our ability! I thank everyone at Zion for supporting this renovation when significant changes and money were needed!

## • New/Future Business:

- Everyone is asked to be vigilant about turning off lights throughout the properties when they are not in use. Among other things, this saves energy as well as the church unnecessary expense.
- Door stop for the Faith Hall kitchen back entrance will be relocated.
- Installation of the updated Ida and Conrad plaque in the Hoehn Chapel entranceway will be done in November. The old one had been eroded and the lettering had all but disappeared; making it unreadable.
- Fields Hall door entranceway to the kitchen area lockset needs to be rebuilt. Pins appear to be worn out.
