I have 2 words for you: Hope & expectation. They're at the heart of our current church season which is Advent.



Next to joy and peace (which are at the heart of the 12 days of Christmas) they're two of the most uplifting feelings to experience.

That's what the God of Jesus wants us to experience, *especially* when we are despairing or suffering, including suffering injustice. When we're in the grips of such darkness, we are to look to the end, where God will bring his own brilliant light, especially in terms of goodness and justice and mercy. When we're in the dark, we can cling to him in hope and expectation. Disease, sin, evil and darkness will eventually give way – whether in our lifetime or at the very end. The crucified & risen God will be the victor – with only life and light in his hands. God is our hope and expectation, and will give us the strength – and even joy – as we ride out the darkness.

One thing that's recently made a number parishioners hopeful and joyous is that Zion received 28 new members - including 13 young children - into our little fold on All Saints Sunday. People have said "good job, Pastor!" as though I deserve all the credit for it. Here's my perspective: First, I'm also hopeful and joyous because of all of the new brothers & sisters. And I really enjoy connecting with families who have young children. Monthly "Chapel" is one of my favorite tasks as Pastor at Zion. But part of the reason they joined is also due to Zion – which truly is a warm, friendly, caring community. Truth be told, I don't think I've experienced any congregation to be *more* caring than Zion. But also – part of the reason they joined is because they felt a need to do so – perhaps a desire to have a deeper connection with God, including for the sake of their children; or to connect with a community after being so isolated in the pandemic, or... who knows?! Perhaps as we get to know them better and even have deeper conversations, we can learn more about what drove them to look for a church at this moment. And don't we also believe that the Holy Spirit "calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth"? (Small Catechism on the 3rd article of the Apostles' Creed). So then, their presence is due to the work of the Holy Spirit – how's that for uplifting?!

There are many things this holiday season about which to be filled with hope and expectation – but the one consistent, sure thing we can rely upon is the eternal promise that God made in Christ: That we are his beloved children and that he will be the victorious in the end – bringing in an eternal reign of justice and mercy... and of goodness and life.

<u>Treasurer's Operating Comments:</u> looking at December 2023

Through September, Congregational giving was favorable by \$1,242 -- essentially flat. But in October and November, Congregational giving in 2023 was below 2022 by more than (\$18,000), which means we'll have a significant year end deficit of about (\$17,000) assuming December 2023 matches 2022.

Expenses are increasing, while the receipts are declining. Not a good pattern entering the new year.

Zion does not and cannot utilize fundraisers for the Operating Budget. Zion depends solely on your financial giving to pay for operational expenses.




time at the beach in the summer and watching movies or playing games together by the fire in the winter:)
