Assisting Ministers wanted at Zion Lutheran Church! Nope, we're not looking for pastors... we're looking for lay people to assist with worship.



The title "assisting minister" dates back to the 1978 green hymnal, the Lutheran Book of Worship, which reclaimed some ancient Christian worship practices. The 2006 red hymnal, Evangelical Lutheran Worship, continued the practice of using lay people to assist with Communion, and also lead some of the prayers, including the intercessory prayers.

Lay people have assisted in Christian worship from its very beginnings. Justin, who wrote the earliest known record of Christian liturgy in the year 155 AD, notes that a presiding minister preaches, gives thanks at the table and enables the distribution of the collection for the poor, amid a liturgy that "we all" do. That same report tells us about several "deacons" (diakonoi – the Greek word for table-server). We can assume that these assistants helped the active assembly and its presiding minister with praying, taking a collection, and distributing the collection to those in need.

On a side note, somebody asked me why we don't pause and wait for the lectors or singers, or even pastor to sit down before we continue with the next thing in worship as it seems slightly rude. For example – shouldn't the lector wait until I sit down before they begin reading? Indeed, we are used to that custom for a performance. However, worship is different than almost any other public gathering. The word "liturgy" means "work of the people." We're all doing this together. The pastors and lectors and singers have their roles in this "work of the people" and when one's role is ended – the work is still going on – it doesn't depend on one of the people who merely have a more public role. For lack of a better image, it's like keeping a ball in the air: Our eyes are on the ball, not the people batting the ball, and everyone has a role to keep the ball in the air – whether in the pews by actively worshipping or in front of the pews by actively leading.

Back to assisting ministers! I will hold an adult forum on Sunday March 3 to share a little bit of history of Christian worship, lay people assisting with worship, and also the particular logistics of what assisting ministers would do in worship at Zion.

After the adult forum, I'll reach out to people I think might be interested and have some gifts for it, hold a training session after worship one Sunday, and then sometime later spring will begin scheduling assisting ministers; that is, if we have enough people who are interested in helping in this way. I think the main gifts are: An ability to speak in front of people and a desire to do it. At any point, please let me know if you're interested in serving in this way.

If this sounds familiar to you - I was planning to begin training assisting ministers in the winter of 2020, and then the pandemic happened! So we'll give it another try for 2024!

Lent is God's Gift to Us

What is Lent?

Lent is mostly known in our culture as a time to give up something good; however, it's really far more meaningful and life-giving than that! At heart, Lent is about seeing that we need for-giveness, and about experiencing God's forgiveness. For Lutherans in particular, Lent isn't a season of sacrifice, but rather, a *gift of time* by which God re-orients us: from insecure, self-centered people into forgiven, other-centered people.

Shrove Tuesday, Pancake Dinner 2/13 6PM - for adults & children (see page 7 for details)

No matter what it's called – Shrove Tuesday, Mardi Gras, Fastnacht – this night is a celebration before the somber season of Lent begins the next day. On Tuesday night we eat pancakes for dinner and conclude the evening by burning last year's palms from Palm Sunday to make ashes for the next day's worship service.

Ash Wednesday, 2/14 7:30PM

We begin Lent being mindful of our mortality "You are dust, and to dust you shall return," and returning to God's mercy and grace. Ashes are optional.
