WTPS Spring Break & Holy Week

The Long Valley school district now schedules spring break on the last week of March which, this year, coincides with Palm/Passion Sunday through Easter Sunday. So we may see an effect on attendance & participation for the Easter Egg hunt and Palm/Passion Sunday celebration. Public school begins again on 4/1 – so we may have some families back for Easter Sunday.

Easter Sunday Breakfast

We finally made the difficult decision: Easter breakfast will be held after worship (10:35 – 11:30am). It used to be held in-between the worship services and trying to decide has been difficult! Jance and I have been polling different groups in order to make the best, imperfect decision possible – which we know will not satisfy everyone. We learned that there are good reasons to hold it before 9:30am worship - as people have Easter lunch to prep, drive to, and eat. Plus there are good reasons to hold breakfast after worship; e.g., some seniors simply can't do early mornings [you try when you're 90:)].

Also, people might eat a mid-day Easter lunch or dinner and so a late breakfast would be welcome.

Easter Sunday Parking

We're planning on a full house – so you might consider coming a little early to find a parking space. We will open up the field and hope for dry ground, and you're also welcome to park along the street in front of the church – as in days of yore at Zion. A good problem to have?!


Thank you to all of you who joined us for VIP day! What great day. We were so happy to have families and guests at school and to show you all the wonderful things your children are doing during the day.
